

LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT.

I, Lydia H. Blackler, of Olympia, Washington, being of sound and disposing mind, do make, publish and declare my last will and testament (hereby revoking all other wills by me made) in words and figures as follows, to-wit:

1. I direct that my debts and funeral expenses, including grave-stones, and the expenses of administration of my estate, be paid; that in the event that I am buried in Olympia I be buried in the same half lot in which my sister, Mary R. Blackler, is buried, and that gravestones similar to those erected on her grave be erected on mine; that the sum of One Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$150.00) to provide for the perpetual care of the whole lot in which my sisters are buried be paid to Olympia Lodge No. 1 of Free and Accepted Masons of Olympia, Washington, for that purpose, unless provision for such care shall have previously been made.

2. I appoint Harry McElroy, Esq., of Olympia, Washington, and James A. Haight, Esq., of Seattle, Washington, as my executors; and, reposing special confidence in each of them, I provide that no bond shall be required of them, and that they be allowed as their compensation four per cent (4%) of the value of the estate, such compensation, however, not to exceed Four Hundred Dollars (\$400.00). I direct that my estate be administered and settled without the intervention of the Probate or Superior Court or any court except for the purpose of the probate of this will.

3. I bequeath to the First Congregational Church of Olympia, Washington, Five Hundred (\$500.00) Dollars to be paid into the fund for building a new church, if such fund exists; otherwise to be applied as the trustees of said church deem best.

I bequeath Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) to "The American Board of Commissioners of Foreign Missions" of Boston, Massachusetts.

I bequeath to my niece, Mrs. Fannie S. O'Brien, of Olympia, Washington, Three Thousand Dollars (\$3000.00); to my grand-niece, Mrs. Helen Aetzel, One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00); and to my grand-nephew, Lloyd O'Brien, One Thousand Dollars (\$1000.00). If either of the two legatees last named shall fail to survive me the sum above provided for such legatee is hereby bequeathed to the other.

4. I direct that the remainder of my invested funds, securities, notes, deposits in bank and cash be divided in seven (7) equal parts and shares. I bequeath one (1) of said shares to each of the following named nieces:

(a) The five (5) daughters of my late brother, Frank C. Blackler, of Smyrna, Turkey, namely: Miss Mary H. Blackler, Miss Ida Blackler, Mrs. Nellie Webber, Mrs. Edith Ashe, and Mrs. Rose McLachlan.

(b) Miss Daphne Kalopothakes, daughter of my late sister, Mrs. Martha Kalopothakes, of Athens, Greece. If I survive said Daphne I bequeath said share provided for her to her brother, Frank Kalopothakes.

The remaining part and share I hereby bequeath to said Frank Kalopothakes in trust for his sister, Dr. Mary Kalopothakes, for her sole and separate use and benefit, to be paid by said trustee to or for said Mary in such sums and at such times and places as said Mary shall direct. In the event that I survive said Dr. Mary Kalopothakes I bequeath said remaining part and share to said Frank Kalopothakes to and for his own use and benefit and free from any trust whatever.

5. I bequeath my personal effects, consisting of books, furniture, pictures, silverware, jewelry, laces, clothing and other articles to said Mrs. Fannie S. O'Brien, and I request her to see that they be distributed according to directions which I shall leave for her.

6. I give, devise and bequeath all the rest, residue and remainder of my estate to said Mrs. Fannie S. O'Brien.

7. Except as otherwise specified in Articles 3 and 4 aforesaid I direct that if any devisee fails to survive me the heirs of such devisee shall take the interest of such devisee, and if any legatee fails to survive me the distributees of such legatee shall take the bequest of such legatee.
